THE INDIAN RESIDENTIAL SCHOOLS  
The first residential school in the west was the St. Mary's Residential School, established in 1861 at St. Mary's, British Columbia. It was the first of a series of schools that were established throughout the province in the 1860s and 1870s. The purpose of these schools was to educate and assimilate the children of the Indian population into the dominant culture of the time.
